Kris Parsons, a representative of Four Feathers, said she will probably take 6 truck loads of donations to South Dakota this year for the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Kris said that the Indian Reservation has between 20,000-30,000 people. Medical supplies are limited and they only have 4 ventilators available to them. Currently, Pine Ridge has 350 active Covid-19 cases and are going on lockdown. Kris works with tribal agencies that know the needs of the people and distribute the donations accordingly.

KLAAS HONORED With Ada Hayden Stone

Ames Parks and Recreation Department and the Friends of Ada Hayden Heritage Park recently held a dedication ceremony for the addition of a heritage stone at Ada Hayden Heritage Park honoring Dr. Erwin Klaas.

Ada Hayden Heritage Park currently has nine heritage stones placed throughout the park recognizing individuals who have made significant contributions to the conservation of natural resources in Iowa. The Friends of Ada Hayden Heritage Park, a partner in the management of the park, proposed the addition of a 10th stone to honor Dr. Klaas because of his efforts in getting the park established and his continued effort in renovating the park to its native habitat.

Dr. Klaas's contributions to conservation in Iowa started in 1975 when he served as Professor of Animal Ecology and a leader of the Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Unit at Iowa State University until his retirement in 1999. After retirement, he used his knowledge and connections with Iowa State and the Ames community to organize a sampling of the plants and animals at the abandoned rock quarry on the north side of Ames.
