## Green Hills Earth Day Outreach Opportunities Sponsored by the Green Team Committee

### ELECTRONICS DONATION

Story County Conservation Center has partnered with Blank Park Zoo and ECO-CELL in recycling small electronics to protect gorillas, okapi, and other wildlife.

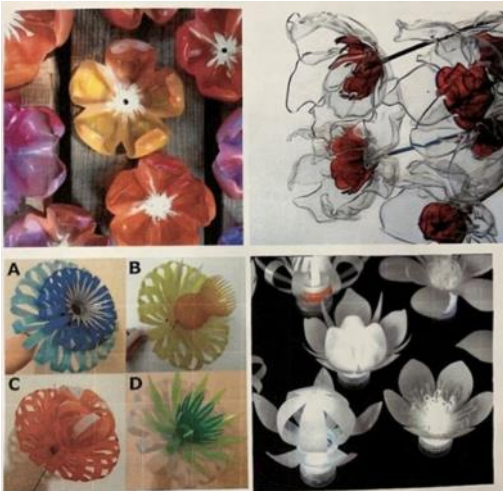
During the month of April, we will be collecting the old small electronic devices that you would like to donate. Simply take them to the collection box located in the coat room near the Community Room.

Acceptable items include: cell phones, smartphones, iPhones, iPods, iPads, tablets, Apple /Android watches, GPS, MP3 players, e-readers, digital cameras, handheld gaming systems and the accessories that come with them. These devices do not need to be functional. Note: Please remove your personal data before donation (such as removing SIM cards, disconnecting service, resetting to factory defaults.)

100% of the proceeds from donations to the program at Blank Park Zoo go to reforestation and conservation efforts in the Democratic Republic of Congo, including the Ituri Forest and the GRACE Gorilla Sanctuary.



ECO-CELL is a nonprofit which reclaims the precious minerals found inside these devices. Recycling these items helps save endangered gorillas by reducing the demand for coltan while 100% of the proceeds from this project go directly towards reforestation in the Congo and care for rescued gorillas.



### TWO LITER PLASTIC BOTTLE COLLECTION

Reiman Garden needs help in collecting pop bottles to make flowers that will be used in the garden's Holiday Show this winter. Water bottles are not strong enough for the winter weather so they won't work but pop bottles will do the trick. They are wanting 2-liter and 20 oz pop bottles.
