## The Green Hills Chimes

#### President's Message

Three months have passed since the Chimes was published to relay information to the Green Hills residents. This is due to no one having stepped up to be the Chimes editor. On a trial basis, items originally in the Chimes are now included with the Green Hills staff monthly publication. We really do need our own membership publication so as not to diminish or defeat the purpose of the staff publication. Someone, please agree to use your talent and skills to be a Chimes Editor!

As to other significant activities, the Oaks 8th floor hallway has been renovated with new lighting, wall paint and handrails. The laundry room has been refurbished and outfitted with new commercial washers and dryers. Furniture has been installed and flooring will be completed when the windows have been installed. Cat 6 wiring has been installed for the internet. Artwork on the walls will be installed on March 30th. The Oak window project will proceed when weather and the schedule of Boone Glass are compatible. April 3rd is tentatively set as the start date. All the windows have been manufactured and delivered. Boone Glass is currently finishing the trim pieces. The Oaks roof membrane will be replaced during June and July.

The roofing project will continue for selected units of the townhomes. Additional curb and gutter work are also included in the work needed for the townhomes.

The Community room acoustics and sound system will be analyzed in September by RDI to make design suggestions for improving the system and sound level when the room is being used.

The Long-Range Planning Committee is preparing to work with RDG to comprise a community plan for future years. This will include health care space, dining space and kitchen along with external space for improvement or expansion. The Maintenance-Shop needs will also be considered, as well as other outdoor spaces.

The Maples addition will be presented to the membership for a vote in April or May. The Capital Planning Committee is working to finalize floor plans and estimated cost for the project. The Finance Committee will be working on the financial aspects of the project so that the membership can be presented with the necessary details to formulate a vote. Kat, our Executive Director, has scheduled several informational meetings to discuss the details and other topics of interest.

The 2024 budget is in the process of being formulated. The first draft will be considered by the Finance Committee on April 4th .

We have nearly made it through another winter. We will soon see the spring birds along with some sunshine to make us smile. We can go outside for fresh air and planting activities. Better dispositions helps us be the "Best We Can Be." Go Cyclones!

#### THE GREEN TEAM CHALLENGE: REDUCING FOOD WASTE

This month keep track of how much food you waste. At the end of the week, look through your notes to understand what you throw away most often and how you can change your ways to prevent that waste. Did you buy more than you can eat before it goes bad? Or did you simply get tired of leftovers?

The Ames Resource Recovery Plant cannot burn garbage contaminated with food waste because it's so wet and greasy that it won't become RDF (resource derived fuel), and eventually ends up going into the landfill.

A 2022 study by the Iowa Department of Natural Resources showed that food waste is by far the most common material going to the state's landfills. Food waste is also the number one material in America's landfills, accounting for 24.1 percent of all municipal solid waste.

#### TIPS:

- If you buy perishable food in bulk, such as fruits, vegetables, and meat, organize your refrigerator so what you need to eat first is up front and visible.
- Take produce out of plastic wrappings. Airtight wrappings suffocate fresh produce and speed up the decay process.
- Don't wash produce until you're ready to eat it. Moisture encourages decomposition and mold growth.
