SPEAKER: JOHN DOBSON Oakes Ames and the Building of the Transcontinental Railroad Tuesday, June 20th at 3:00 PM Community Room

The city of Ames is named for Massachusetts Congressman Oakes Ames. A prominent politician and businessman, he played a key role in the construction of the Union Pacific Railroad---a project that riveted the nation's attention after the Civil War. John's talk will begin with a review of the complex political maneuvers that underlay the decision to build a transcontinental railroad, examine some of the obstacles and achievements that marked the building process, and highlight the methods Oakes Ames employed to round up and manage the funds needed to complete the project. His fortunes changed dramatically in the early 1870s, however, so his place in history remains quite controversial.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

By the time you read this you know that a new Executive Director, Calista Sievers, has been hired by LCS, our Management Company, to replace Kat, who has taken another job at LCS. Calista was interviewed by the GH and HCC Boards and the staff supervisors prior to LCS offering her the ED position. Her resume is available for review by request through the main GH office.

Calista will bring a strong financial background to Green Hills. She has a delightful personality, an excellent attitude, and an ardent desire to keep Green Hills the best it can be. Calista will be at Green Hills on June 12. Please welcome her and give her an opportunity to learn who you are. It will be important to wear your name tag.

If you attended the Annual Meeting on May 19th, you know that your monthly fees increased significantly and that expansion at Green Hills is necessary for a variety of reasons.

Three of the reasons are:

- It will help to keep monthly fees from increasing so much by spreading the costs over more residents. Our expectations are that this will spread the operating costs over 183 units rather than the current 163 units. Currently 15 downpayments have been made for the 20 apartments.
- 2. It will help to provide Green Hills with more health-care residents. Currently about 50% of our health-care residents are from outside of Green Hills. We will have more competition for these outside residents as the new health care facility in Nevada, Iowa gets built and operated sometime in 2025. We will need more Green Hills residents to fill the spaces we may see vacated by the nearby competition for health care. Please remember that we are the only 5-star health–care facility in Ames.
- 3. The Maples expansion of 20 apartments will provide about \$200,000 per year additional funds to help with maintenance and repairs costs.

To sustain our future at Green Hills, I am asking for your "YES" vote for the Maples Expansion. We need 80% approval to proceed. Please attend one of Kat's presentations concerning this issue to get the details of why it is so important to vote "YES" for this expansion.

THE GREEN TEAM CHALLENGE:


The June challenge is to recycle glass bottles and jars.
