# **GHRA President's Message**

Recently a friend sent me the following statement. "So in retrospect, in 2016, not a single person got the answer right to: Where do you see yourself 5 years from now?" At Green Hills we're not going to let that happen.

First, we have a Master Plan Committee (MPC) that is envisioning our needs in order to sustain Green Hills for the next 20 years. They are exploring the perceived needs in 5-year increments using data relative to the growth of the aging population. This committee consists of Peg Cutlip, Paul Reitz, Suzie Shierholz, and Allen Trenkle. They have been meeting weekly since April, 2021.

Second, we have a Strategic Planning Committee (SPC) that will develop the 5-year plan in relation to the MPC input and our resources (e.g. dollars, staff, space, etc.). Our current 5-year plan ends on June 30, 2022. The MPC will provide significant input to the SPC for the 5-year plan.

To accomplish the 5-year plan the SPC will be following the outline of objectives that resulted from the 2-day Envision Conference sponsored by LCS a few months ago. Many of you participated in that conference and provided important input on the needs at Green Hills. In that regard, the SPC chaired by Charles Kniker and Paul Brackelsberg have formed six major Task Forces. Namely:

- Task Force #1 Financial/Budget
- Task Force #2 Staff
- Task Force #3 Capital Planning
- Task Force #4 Marketing
- Task Force #5 Amenities/Culture
- Task Force #6 Technology

Each of these Task Forces will have a leader or coordinator and several members per Task Force. One or more staff members will be assigned to each Task Force to ensure feasibility and manageability within GH resources.

Each Task Force will have several tasks to consider and each task may need a leader with specific interests in that particular task. Over 40 people have agreed to work on the SPC and more are welcome as may relate to specific tasks. If interested, let me know by telephone 520-9641 or email JLH69558@msn.com.

With this plan and your cooperation, Green Hills, in conjunction with our LCS management team, will know where we're going to be in the next 5-years. However, sometimes plans change for a variety of reasons. Thus, the SPC and the LCS management team will stay alert for any modifications that may be needed in the plan during our next 5-year time frame.



## BOOK REVIEW "There There" by Tommy Orange



Tommy Orange is an American urban Indian. He is a citizen of the Cheyenne and Arapaho Tribes. His first book, There There, has received numerous awards ranging from the American Book Award for Outstanding Literary Achievement to the Andrew Carnegie Medal for Excellence in Fiction. He was also a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in Literature in 2019.

His book begins with a prologue that reports the actual history of the American Indian since the Pilgrims first settled here. He then begins his fictitious storytelling of thirteen characters who are urban Indians in the city of Oakland, California. Some characters are caught up in drugs and alcohol, while others have finished college degrees but have not found any jobs using their abilities. Others are women who are trying to bring up children, and instill in them knowledge of who they are, while protecting them in the urban surroundings.

These various stories come together in a massive Pow Wow where the characters are drawn together, some because they wanted to share in their native heritage and learn more about who they are and begin to understand more, and others who want to profit in a negative way from the Pow Wow by robbing it.

This is a book that leads to a lot of thought and consideration about the American Indian.
