The challenge for this month is to carpool or take the bus twice in October. Even if you are capable of driving, take the bus, especially if riders are needed. Share a ride to church, to a club meeting or to lunch. You'll save money on gas and do a bit for the environment!

FOOD DIVERSION AT GREEN HILLS AND THE CITY OF AMES

According to the EPA, In the U.S., 30 to 40 percent of the food supply is never eaten, wasting the resources used to produce it and creating many environmental impacts. Food waste is the single most common material land filled and incinerated in the U.S.

Many of you have been using the Subpods this summer, to keep food waste out of the garbage, but they will be closed during the cold season. For those who wish to continue to keep food waste out of the landfill, the City of Ames has a Food Waste Diversion (FWD) program. This is an opportunity for Green Hills residents who want an alternative to putting organic waste in the trash and burying it in a land fill.

Some people use ice cream pails to store organic waste collection in the freezer, under the sink, in the garage, or another out-of-theway spot. Of course, having a freezer is ideal to store waste temporarily, according to members of the Green Team.

Some people purchase a collection bucket (with a lid) through the City at a cost of \$20. When you're ready to dispose of your organic waste, drop off at the outdoor bin located at the Resource Recovery Plant. Collected materials get trucked to Eddyville and turned into compost.

Knowing that organic material that isn't repurposed released methane gas, gives us an incentive to reduce methane gas which is worse than carbon emissions.

The Green Team is planning an information session in early November for those interested in learning more about the Waste Diversion program.
