HISTORY OF US - SPANISH RELATIONS, 1775 —1900 Wednesday, September 21 at 3:00 PM Community Room

All are invited to this presentation given by John Dobson. Even though Spain informally assisted in the American Revolution, relations between the US and Spain were seldom amicable in subsequent decades. This talk will cover the negotiations and treaties that the two countries hammered out over time, almost always to Spain's disadvantage. The final humiliation occurred in 1898 when the United States declared war on Spain to assist Cubans fighting for independence and caused Spain to lose control of the last major elements of her global empire.

#### **GREEN HILLS BUS POLICY**

In order to use the Green Hills bus for events in Ames, a minimum of seven (7) residents must be signed up. Fourteen (14) residents must be signed up for out-of-town events. This does not include guests.

If transportation services for popular events exceed the capacity of the bus, a waiting list will be available for residents to sign up in the case of cancellations. A local motor coach company is used for transportation when 30 or more residents wish to attend the same event. Please sign up early, so this determination can be made due to a 72-hour advance notice to schedule or cancel a driver.

Sign-up sheets for events are on the counter at the Reception Desk in a binder. Sign up by writing your name in the next available blank on the activity sheet. If you need to cancel your reservation, cross off your name. Please do not erase your name if you need to cancel. Likewise, please do not write your name over a crossed-out name. If a resident should cancel, staff will contact the next resident on the alternate list. A Green Hills resident may not be swapped out for a family member or guest to go in their place. As long as there is room on the bus for all residents, guests are welcome to attend bus trips. Residents should sign up their guests in the third column on the bus sheet. Charges for resident's guests will be charged to the resident's account for bus services when applicable. Guests are only allowed with a resident escort.
