PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hope you all were able to attend the Annual Shareholder's Meeting on May 29th. The update of the Board approved changes in the Bylaws was approved by the appropriate number of shareholders. The new Advisory Council and Board members were announced, and details of the 2024-2025 Budget were reviewed. Your new monthly fee document will be in your Green Hills mailbox.

The Board approved budget includes an overall merit increase for staff averaging 4% and appropriate increases in certain base wages to keep us competitive for hiring staff when needed or required. In total, the Green Hills Residence Association staff about 30 (29.95) FTEs. The monthly fee increases averaged 4.8% or \$114. The second person fee increased \$20 from \$315 to \$335. The monthly food minimum was raised to \$140 per person per month to accommodate the actual cost of food and personnel. The budget includes a 0.25 FTE for a part-time Accounts Payable Specialist and 1.5 FTE for a Security position, 10 hours per day (mostly nighttime) and 7 days per week.

The construction for the new Maples is progressing on schedule with footings and foundation walls in process of installation. So far, we have 11 units sold.

Green Hills has purchased Unit 208 in the Oaks so it can be combined with Unit 210, a one-bedroom unit, which we already own. The larger combination of 208 and 210 will be easier to sell. Unit 209 (another one-bedroom unit) in the Oaks will be used for Physical Therapy on a trial basis for up to one year. The Oaks hallways will be finished during this new fiscal year.

Recently there was an unexpected HVAC failure in the Health Care Center. A fan blade broke loose and cut into two condensing coils causing leakage of all the refrigerant fluid in the unit. Repair costs estimated by the Baker Company ranged from \$30,000 to \$40,000 depending on what is replaced. The GHHC Board voted to replace all coils and fan motors and fan blades at the \$40,000 cost. In this regard, that renders the condensing unit to be essentially new with Baker assurance the repair and replacement items will last at least 5 years. The original unit provided 12 years of service prior to the failure. The Capital Planning Committee was tasked with affecting its replacement. The Baker Company will be inspecting all our HVAC units as a measure to prevent similar or other future failures.

The sound panels recommended by RDI have been ordered. After they are installed, the sound system will be upgraded. This will help improve the Community room acoustics so we can be "the best we can be."

Paul Brackelsburg has extended an invitation to enjoy a ride on his pontoon boat again this year. The tour will be divided into 2 groups and we will take turns on the boat and seeing the farm.

We'll start at Paul's lake home, enjoy the view and light refreshments, then drive around the lake and make our way to the farm.



Enjoy a catered lunch from Tripple Berry Farm. We'll have pulled pork sandwiches, mac-n-cheese, homemade potato chips, and lemon raspberry cupcakes.

After lunch, half the group will stay for a tour of the Early Morning Harvest Farm stone mill and aquaponics greenhouse. Early Morning Harvest cultivates grains, produce, honey, and eggs on



their family farm near Panora. They stone-grind their certified organic grains into flours, meals, and cereals. Their year-round produce grows in aquaponic, hydroponic, and seasonal greenhouses and gardens. Caring for their land and animals is their top priority, and they take pride in never using synthetic chemicals on their farm.

The other half of the group will drive back to the marina where Captain Paul will be your personal tour guide around Lake Panorama. He will show you all the beautiful spots on the lake. The boat ride will last about 1 hour and then the groups will swap.
